approved by the Board of Public Accountancy

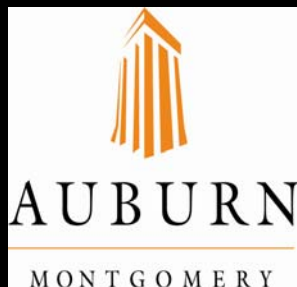
