New Applicants

Complete and return the attached application for admission along with a nonrefundable check or money order for \$25 payable to Auburn Montgomery. Credit cards are welcome for those who walk in or apply online. Transfer or transient students from Auburn University, cross-enrolled students from Alabama State University, Faulkner University and Huntingdon College, and auditors are not required to pay the application fee. Applications and required documents should be sent to Auburn Montgomery, Office of Enrollment Services, P.O. Box 244023, Montgomery, AL 36124-4023. All information should be received by the dates indicated below:

Freshman Applicants

For freshman applicants, a combination of ACT or SAT scores and academic grade-point average will be used to determine admission. A minimum composite ACT score of 18 (SAT of 860) requires a grade-point average of no less than 2.3 for full admission. Provisional admission or admission to the Prelude program may be available to motivated students who do not meet the above requirements.

Have your high school send one official transcript to the Auburn Montgomery Office of Enrollment Services. Following your graduation, a final transcript must be sent. If your ACT or SAT scores do not appear on your transcript, please have scores sent to our office. AUM's ACT and SAT codes are 0057 and 1036, respectively. ACT or SAT information is available from your high school counselor or from ACT, Box 451, Iowa City, IA 52243-0451; SAT, College Board, Box 592, Princeton, NJ 08541-0592.

Transfer Applicants

Transfer applicants should have a cumulative grade-point average of no less than 2.0 for full admission.

Have each college or university you have attended send one official transcript to the Auburn Montgomery Office of Enrollment Services. If you are currently enrolled, an additional final transcript must be sent upon completion of course work. If you have earned fewer than 24 semester hours or 36 quarter hours, you must also meet freshman admission requirements detailed above.

Second Undergraduate Degree Applicants

Applicants seeking a second undergraduate degree must have one official transcript sent to the Auburn Montgomery Office of Enrollment Services from each institution attended. Residency requirements for the awarding of a second bachelor's degree begin upon enrollment in this classification.

Unclassified Applicants

Admission to undergraduate programs as an unclassified student may be granted to individuals holding a baccalaureate degree or higher. Have one official transcript sent to the Auburn Montgomery Office of Enrollment Services from the institution where you completed your highest degree.

Audit Applicants

A student may audit a lecture course or the lecture portion of a combined lecture/laboratory course only with the approval of the instructor, department head, and dean of the school in which the course is offered and when available faculty and facilities permit. Students must complete this application but are not required to pay the application fee.
