

## **Introduction**

The University's Strategic Plan reflects a commitment to providing high quality living and learning environments for Students, Faculty, Staff and visitors. Auburn University at Montgomery (AUM) sits on approximately 516 acres. In 1971 AUM relocated to east Montgomery and opened with two buildings and continues to build today. AUM has 52 buildings/structures. The majority of the campus buildings are constructed of concrete frame, brick veneer, and flat built up roofs.

Using the building classifications defined by the Alabama Commission of Higher Education (ACHE), AUM has 9 distinct building classifications. ACHE classifications used at AUM are; Classroom/Educational, Laboratory, Library, Gymnasium, Student Center, Utility Plant, Facilities Shop, Residence, and Warehouse/Storage/Other. Table 1 illustrates the % SQFT per category (Appendix 1 ACHE comprehensive Facility Category Codes).

Auburn University at Montgomery maintains dedicated facilities needed to deliver instructional academic content. The university offers these instructional programs within 12 buildings (including athletic instructional venues) that collectively house 56 classrooms, 18 labs and 38 specialized classrooms/labs. Examples of specialized classrooms/labs are; art studios, communication labs, computer program labs, curriculum labs, english writing labs, math labs, theater, etc. The scheduling of these spaces are decentralized and managed by the various Colleges throughout the campus. Changes to these spaces must be presented to the university Space Planning Committee. The current university inventory of academic instruction spaces is below.
