Summary:

Dr. Kaur has more than twenty-five years of national and international teaching, research and service experience. She joined Auburn University at Montgomery (AUM) in the year of 2011, and in her 10 years at AUM has distinguished herself in teaching, research, and service. At AUM, she has taught twenty graduate courses, twenty-nine undergraduate, twenty-six combined undergraduate and graduate, thirteen comps, thirteen internship and directed research undergraduate and graduate courses. She has also assisted 55 students to become CITI certified researchers.

In the area of research, she has two books and twenty peer-reviewed articles, one policy paper approved by American Society of Criminology, World Society of Victimology, and Criminologist without Borders for presentation and proceedings in the UN, and one research findings has been included in the UN Global Police Training Manual. She has three book chapters, completed eight grant awards, and three non-peer reviewed articles. She is part of a grant proposal due for submission by June 30, and has two articles and set of police training materials in progress. She has presented in twenty-five conferences twelve with invitation including four in the United Nations. She is serving on a prestigious project, Global Virtual Engagement Committee, of International Association of Women Police to review the training needs of women police in the virtual society.
