SUMMARY

In Fall 2011 when I joined Auburn University at Montgomery (AUM), I was an established academician in higher education, police administrator and trainer, researcher, volunteer, and fundraiser. During my service at AUM, I have distinguished myself in teaching, research, and service. I maintain certifications for online teaching, graduate faculty status, teaching of writing-intensive courses and IRB CITI in Social Sciences. In 2021, I received Ten-Year Successful Teaching Recognition Certificate. In 2015, I received Faculty Recognition Award for strong influence on student academic success and also a Staff Appreciation Award. For the last 10 years, my average score from Chair's Annual Evaluations in each of the three areas of teaching, research and service have been 3.5 (exceeds expectations) on a 4-point scale. Based on feedback of approximately 1180 students who have attended my courses, my student evaluation scores on average continuously have been 4.0 – 4.5 on a 5-point scale.

My teaching, research and service intertwined. I bring my research and service experiences to the classroom by engaging students in research, supervising students to become certified researchers, sponsoring memberships for the justice institutions, proposing new courses to keep student learning current and relevant, providing mentorship opportunities to students, writing recommendation letters, and serving as a reference for students in jobs and scholarship opportunities. With an intent to promote scientific research and evidence-based practices, I have developed individual research partnerships and collaborations with prestigious global policy making and justice institutions to include United Nations, International Association of Women Police, Academic Council of United Nations and American Society of Criminology.

In the area of teaching, I have taught twenty-nine graduate courses, thirty-six undergraduate courses and twenty-six combined undergraduate and graduate courses. Supervised thirteen internships and directed research projects of undergraduate and graduate students. Twice yearly for seven years, 2013 to 2020, along with Dr. Ralph Ioimo, I organized thirteen Comps Contact Programs to provide resources for graduate students to successfully complete the comprehensive exam. Additionally, to strengthen the research skills and resume of our students, I assisted sixty-eight students in their becoming certified researchers by completing CITI certification, a free online research training for students.

In the area of research, I have published three books, one police training manual, three book chapters, eighteen-peer-reviewed articles, one journal editor and panel review article and two non-peer reviewed articles. I have presented and participated in thirty-two-conferences, twelve by

invitation to include four invitations from United Nations. In 2019, I had a major breakthrough in research when my two research papers presented in the American Society of Criminology were evaluated by premium justice research organizations as being relevant for bringing global impact. Both papers were recommended for presentation at UN platform and inclusion in the United Nations proceeding. Below are a few details.

- *“Role and Scope of Women Police in Cybercrime and Victimization,”* a policy paper presented in the annual meeting of American Society of Criminology, an organization which holds consultative status with the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC), was reviewed and recommended by World Society of Victimology, Criminologist without Borders and American Society of Criminology for presentation and inclusion in the UN proceedings.
- *“Rising Cyber Violence against Women and Girls and Preparedness of Women Police Stations in India and Cyber Unites in USA,”* a policy paper was presented in the annual meeting of American Society of Criminology. Research findings of the paper were shared with the International Association of Women Police (IAWP), another organization which holds consultative status with the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC). Findings of the research were included in the *UN Global Police Training Manual*.

In summer 2021, IAWP invited me to serve on their “Global Virtual Engagement Committee,” to review the training needs of women police globally. Based on my experience and research, I proposed four initiatives for gender mainstreaming and strengthening of the women police. Two of the initiatives have been approved and sponsored by the Board of Directors and adopted by IAWP. Brief information of both initiatives and my role in execution of the initiatives are provided below:

- Graduate Fellowship Program (GFP) for women police officers: With intent to enhance the education and research among women police officers, \$3000 (USD) has been made available for an annual Graduate Fellowship for women police officers. IAWP annually invite and evaluate research proposals to select recipient for the award. Announcement for this year’s applications for the award has been made and research proposals are due by July, 2022.
 - A Research Paper Series of International Association of Women within the Criminal Justice Research Network (CJRN) and Women and Gender Studies Network (WGSRN) of SSRN has been started to encourage, promote and share research among women police officers. Series will be published four times a year and call for the articles for Volume1, Issue1, has been completed.

In the area of service, I maintain membership in prestigious agencies and organizations such as UN Women, Academic Council of United Nations, International Associate of Women Police, and American Society of Criminology. I serve as a Senator of my college. Sponsor a travel grant, Pace Kaur Bahl, for women police officers to participate in the annual meetings of American Society of Criminology. I serve on the editorial board of a journal, regularly review articles for journals and direct an agreement of international mutual academic understanding.
