What is Meta-Assessment

- An assessment of assessment.
- Widely shifting from a best practice to the standard.
- Two Levels:
 - Level 1: Assessment of Reporting
 - Level 2: Assessment of Student Learning
 - As Level 1 matures, we will be able to focus more deeply into Level 2.

The Purposes of Meta-Assessment

- Standardizing a feedback cycle
- Effect on improving maturity and efficacy
- Incorporating multiple people/viewpoints
- Enforces expectations and promotes best practices
- Develop a culture of assessment (quote below)
- Helps OIE determine how to improve
- Ensures successful passage during upcoming SACSCOC reviews.

Culture of Assessment pt. 1

"Arcario et al. (2013) cited visible leadership support, faculty ownership and recognition, and intensive professional development as critical factors in creating a culture of assessment which has led to documented improvements in student learning. Leadership must convey the importance of the assessment process through <u>communication</u> and <u>actions</u> if it is to be valued and sustained (Banta and Palomba 2015; Banta et al. 2009) because committed campus leaders are key drivers of effective assessment (Suskie 2009)."

Linking Results to Student Improvement

- Provide feedback with ideas of how to adapt instruction given the results
 - Help them, as a fellow faculty member, with ways to improve student outcomes in the classroom
- Brainstorm ways to increase the usefulness of assessment
 - Meet with faculty involved in assessment, not just assessment coordinator?

"A ... publication (Banta 2011) provided an analysis of 146 assessment case studies and found that only 9 (6%) presented evidence that an action led to improved student learning."
