<p>The annual survey of current and former students was conducted in the Spring semester of 2017. This year there were 14 respondents.</p> <p>Results in brief (see full results for details): <u>The “Most Important Reason” AUM was selected</u> for their degree (57.14%) was CACREP accreditation. The 2nd most was CACREP accreditation & Tuition Cost and (3) Academic Reputation.</p> <p><u>The 3 highest rated “Training Areas”</u> were: (1) Ethical & Legal Issues (81.82%), (2) Helping Professional Skills (75%) and (3) Individual Counseling Theories (75%).</p> <p>There were a scattering of low scored training areas that showed no real pattern.</p> <p>The Students rated the faculty as <u>most helpful in encouraging membership</u> in CSI (80%) and ACA (50%). Encouraging membership in ACA Division was ranked lowest.</p> <p>The Students rated the faculty as <u>most helpful in mentoring “Counseling Skills and Attitudes”</u> (100%) with “Diversity” being second (70%). Only 3 (30%) indicated faculty were helpful with research, employment, and other education opportunities Employment Opportunities with only 25% indicating that this was helpful. Faculty observe that the respondent pool is small and mostly newer students which may account for this.</p> <p>Comments on the survey were varied but some suggest more lecture and direct professor interaction is desired.</p>		<p>Dissemination: Placed on the Program Web page at http://education.aum.edu/academic-programs/graduate-programs/counselor-education Stakeholders were notified of the survey’s availability via email (see attached copy).</p> <p>Outcomes:</p> <p>(1) Low outlier scores in the training areas will be monitored for developing patterns.</p> <p>(2) Faculty observed that the overall scores surrounding professional involvement and identity are good and show improvement from previous surveys.</p> <p>(3) Faculty also observed that the overall scores surrounding mentoring are good and show improvement.</p> <p>(4) The comments suggesting more faculty interaction and less completely online classes are encouraging. As enrollment grows, more lecture and hybrid based sections will be opened for students.</p>

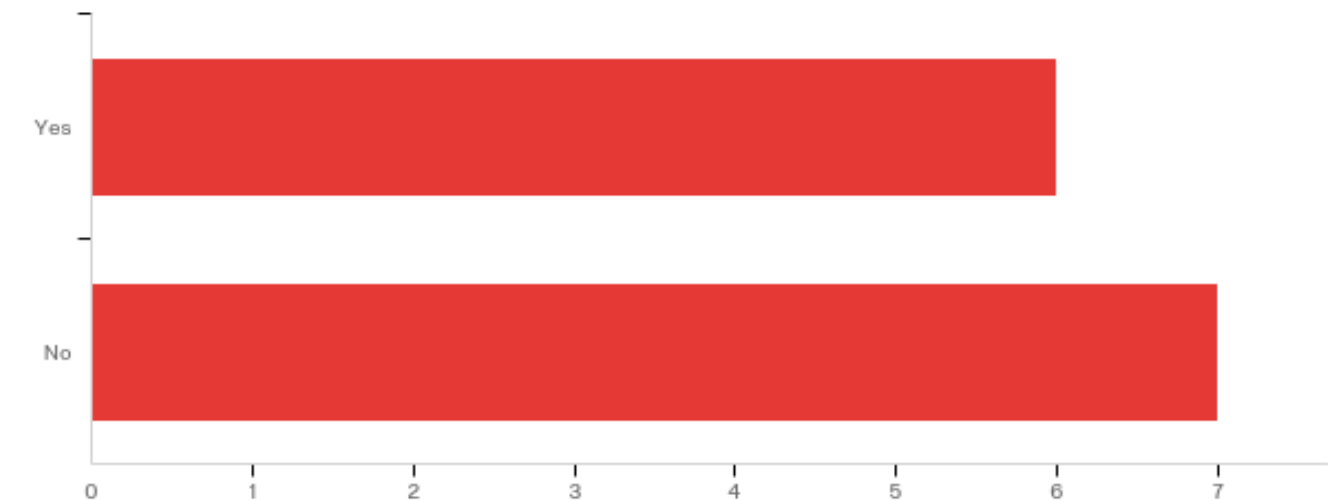

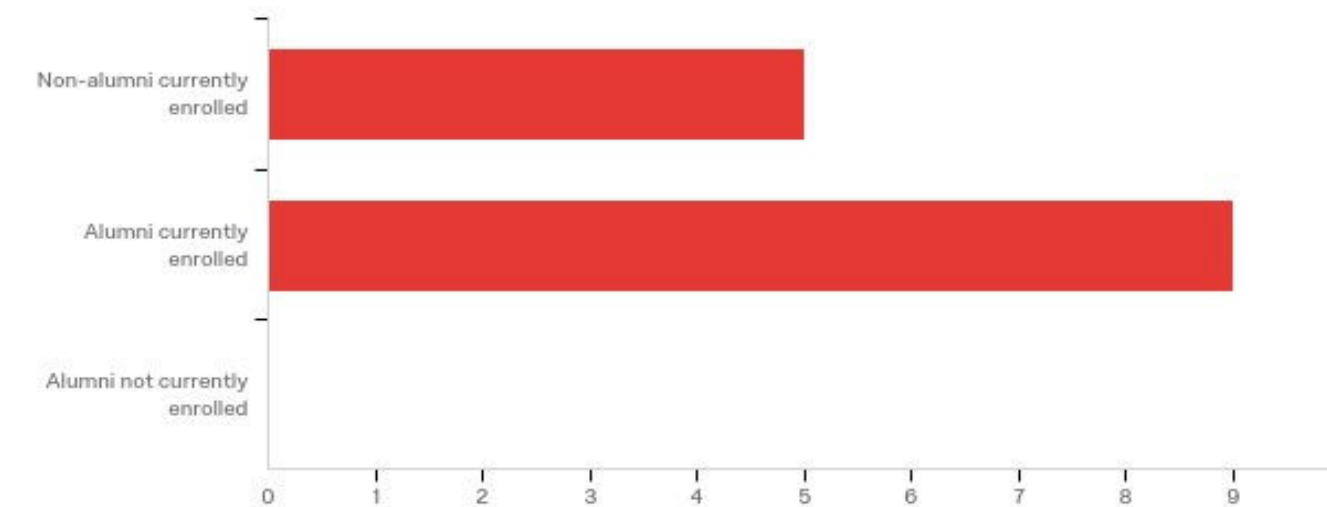

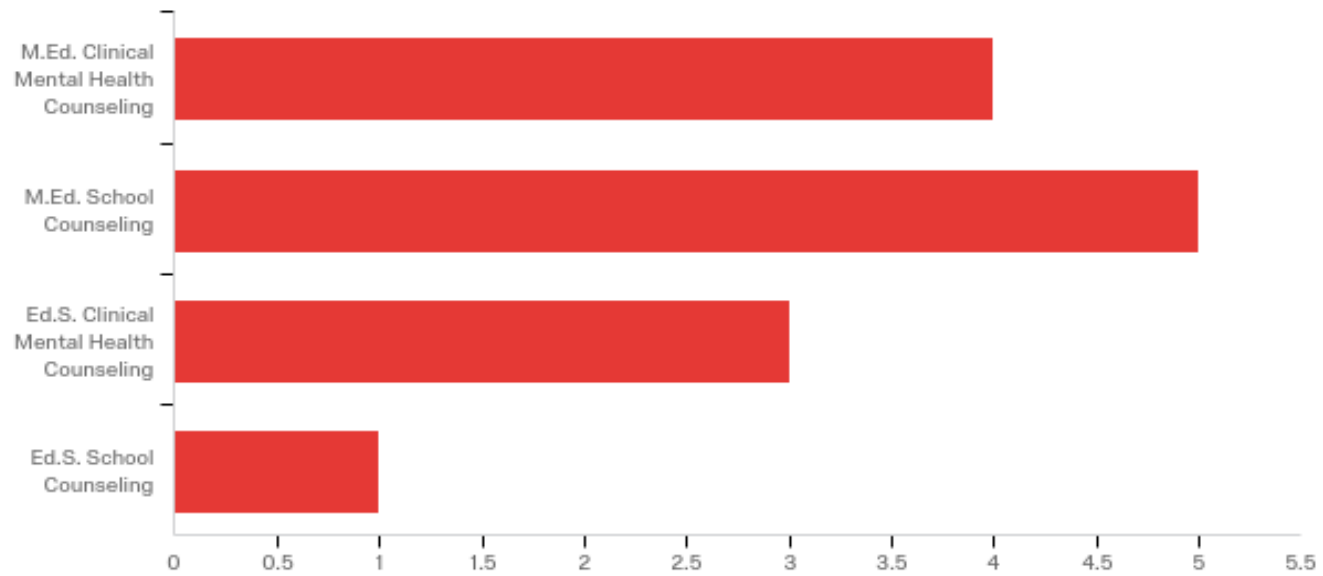

Q5 - Indicate which of the following applies to your current status.



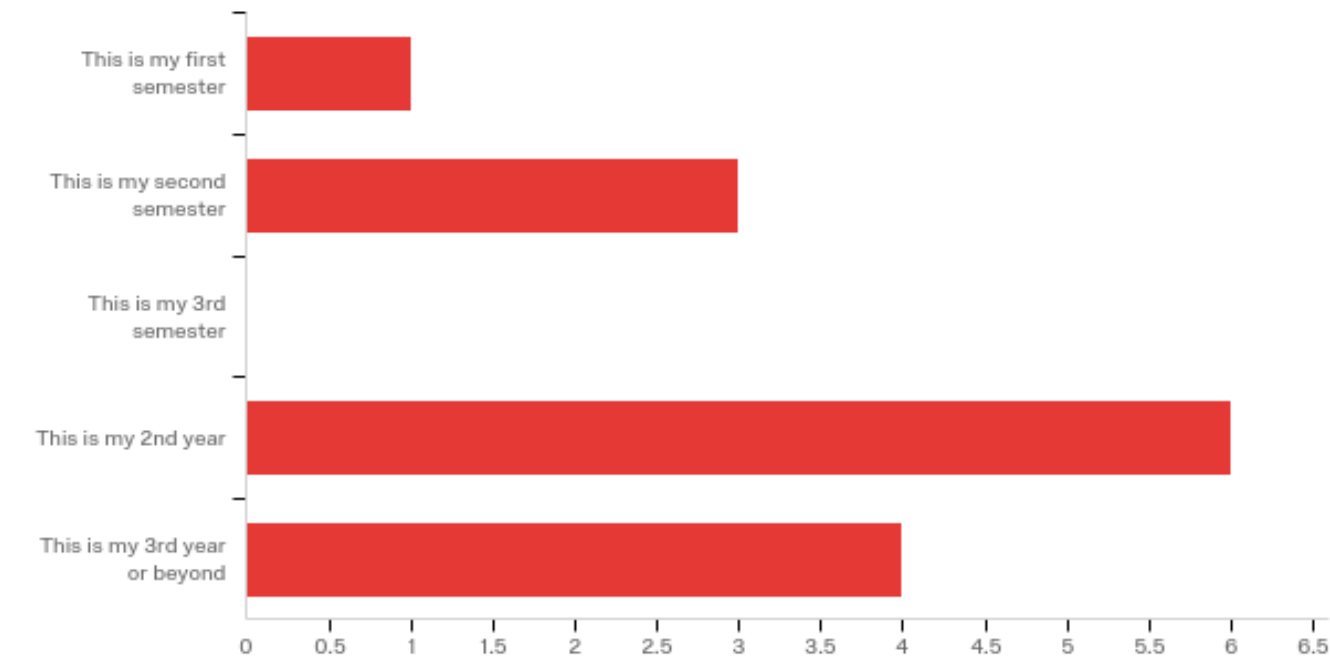

Q6 - What degree in the Auburn Montgomery Counseling Program are you currently pursuing?



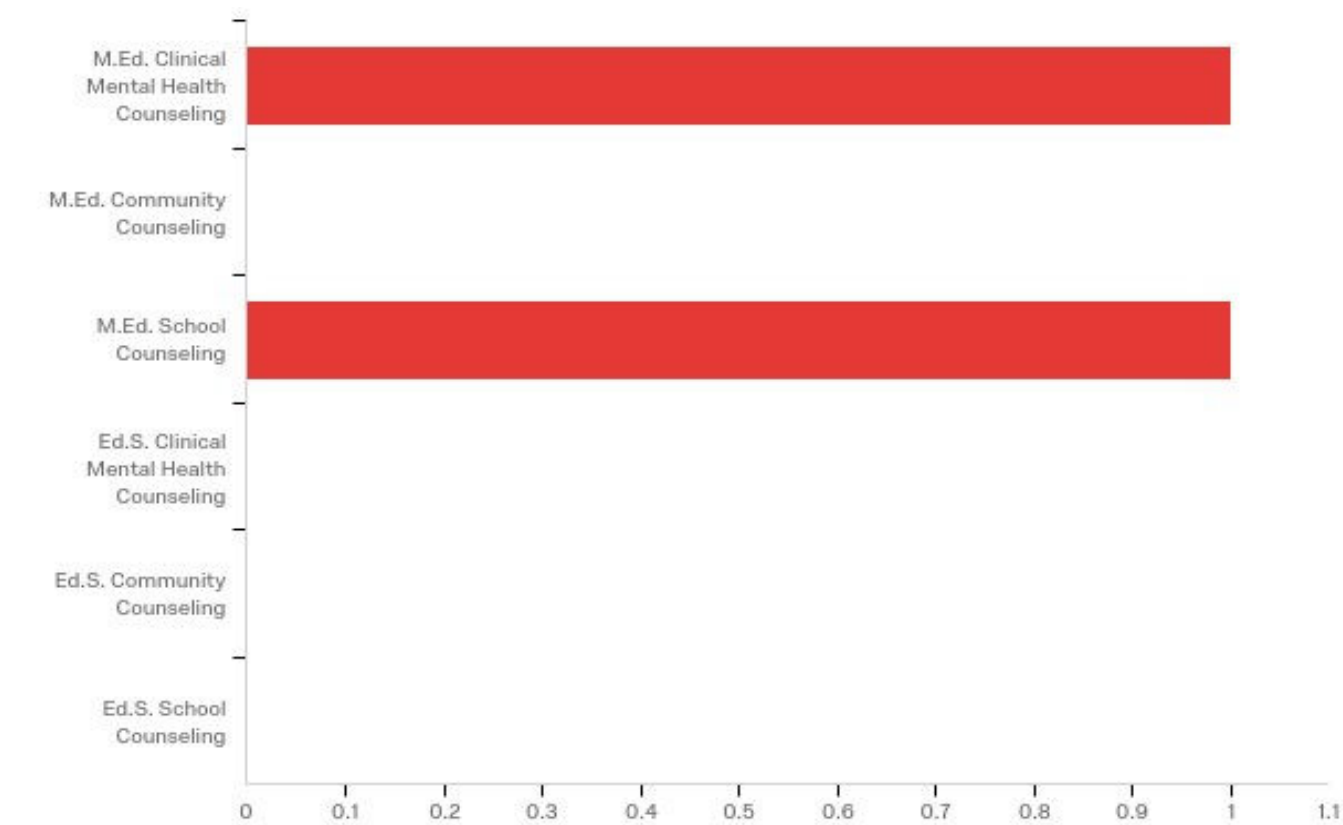

Q7 - How long have you been enrolled in the program?



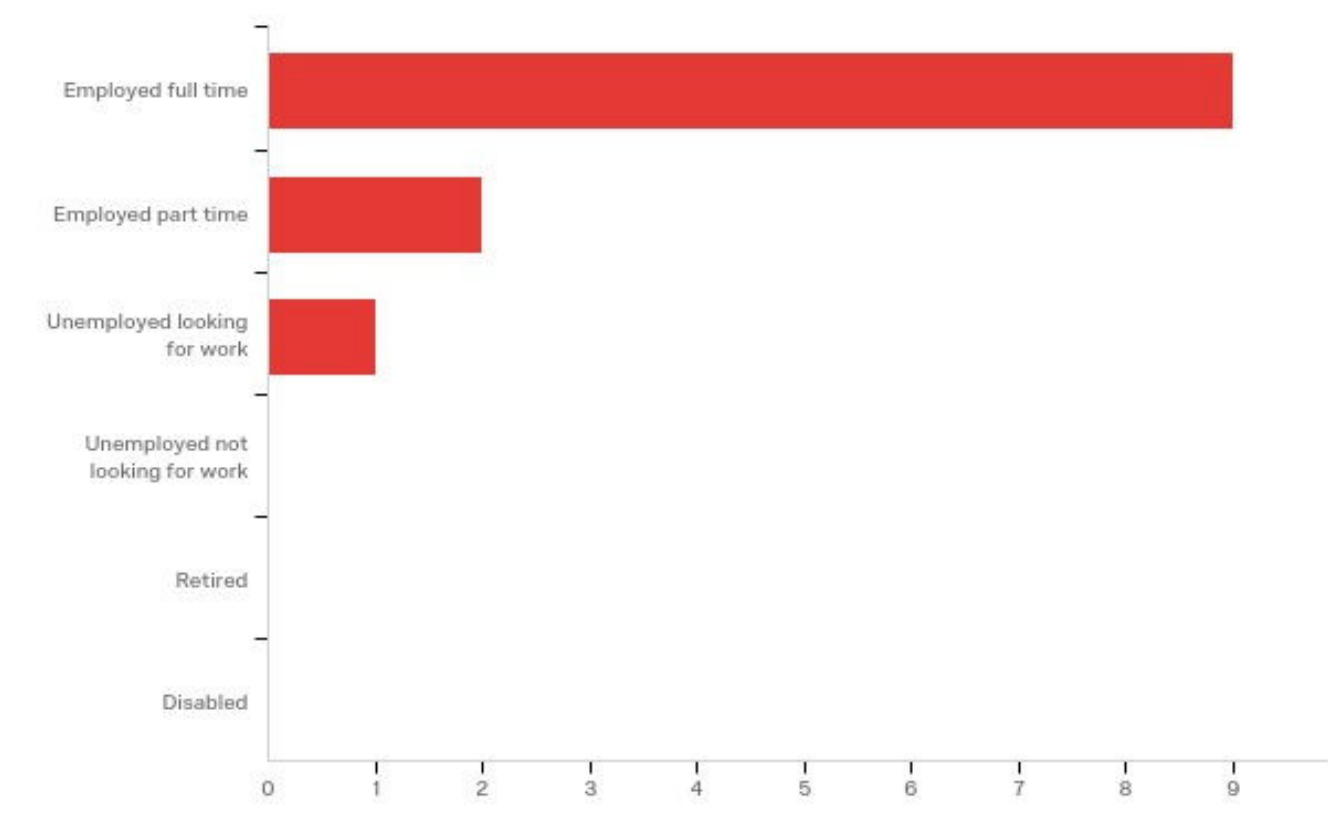

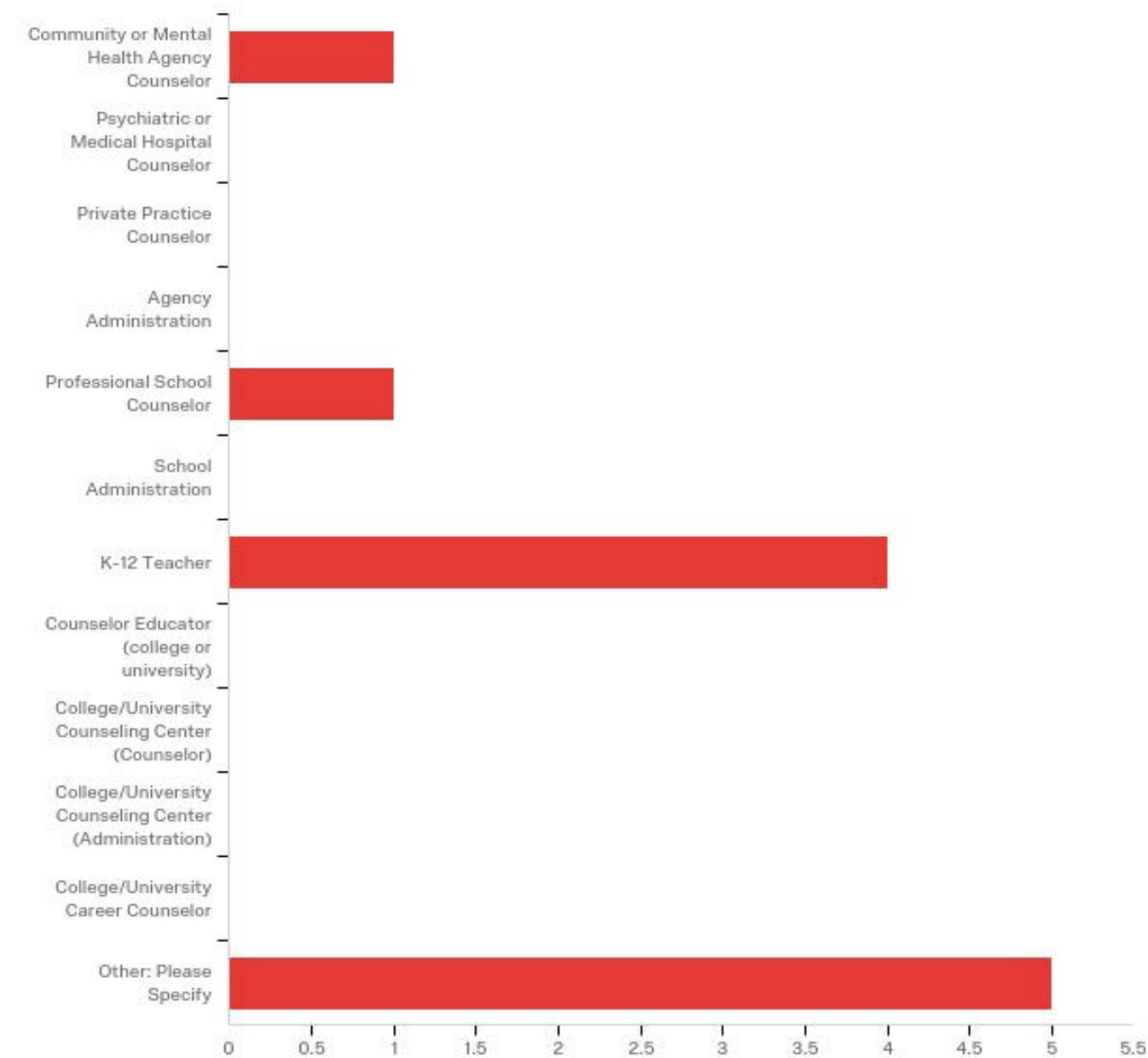

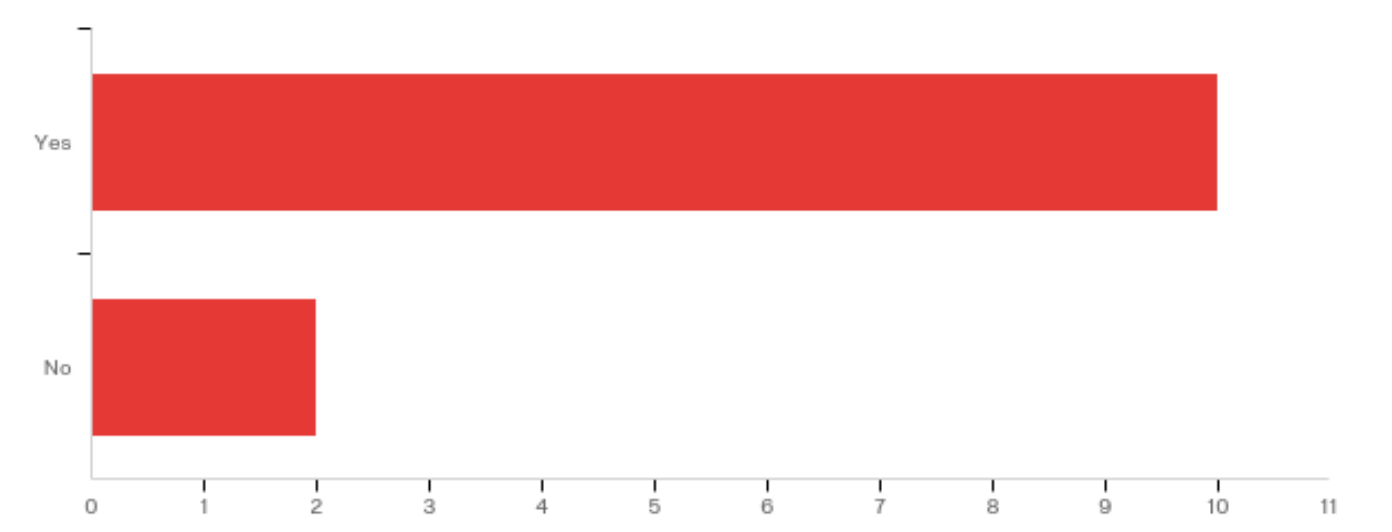
