Major Focus: Accounting

We asked Ms. Rhonda Seay about program offerings and student activities in the School of Accountancy

The School of Accountancy is dedicated to advancing the field of accounting and preparing tomorrow's accounting leaders. Throughout the undergraduate program, accounting majors will receive a well-rounded accounting education preparing them to become professionals in public accounting firms, industry, government agencies, nonprofit organizations as well as other businesses.

Students experience numerous opportunities to network with prospective employers and gain insight on career opportunities within the accounting profession. The majority of students receive full-time job offers at the conclusion of their accounting internships and before enrolling in the Master of Accountancy (MAcc) Program.

Students who desire careers in public accounting must obtain 30 additional hours beyond the 120 hours required for the undergraduate degree in order to academically qualify for certification as a CPA. Most students pursue those additional hours through the MAcc Program. The MAcc Program provides students additional technical skills, research and communication skills, as well as focused preparation on passing the CPA Exam on the first sitting.

The current market for qualified accounting professionals allows students to receive high salaries and continued earning potential as they progress in their career.

Study Skills Mentoring: Study Tips, Tools, and Take-Aways

Quick Tip: NOTES ARE ONLY AS GOOD AS WHAT YOU DO WITH THEM LATER!



- Notes are a starting point for exam prep. Your notes will be most useful if you think of them as a jumping off point for further learning. You will remember information better by seeing it multiple times and thinking about it in different ways.
- **Use all of your senses.** Using a range of senses while taking and using notes can help you remember information. For example, try writing your notes, then talking through them with a classmate, then drawing a picture based on main concepts.
- **Make connections.** Read and take notes before class, add to notes during class, and make connections between concepts during and after class.
