

The Auburn University at Montgomery MPA Program Fact Sheet

The Auburn University at Montgomery Master's Degree Program in Public Administration offers a curriculum that provides students with the training essential for understanding and solving today's complex policy problems, thereby positioning students for opportunities across the public, non-profit, and private sectors.

The program requires completion of twelve courses (36 credit hours) at a 3.0 GPA or higher. The twelve required courses include six core (required) courses, five elective courses, and a capstone seminar taken in the student's final semester.

The program offers elective courses in several areas including state and local administration, nonprofit leadership, and data analysis and policy evaluation. The plan of study identifies current offerings and is available on the program website:

Full- and Part-time Students

The program welcomes full-time and part-time students. Full-time students, those who take at least three courses in both the fall and spring semesters, can complete the program in four semesters. Most students opt to take fewer courses per semester and complete the program within six to eight semesters.

In Fall 2022, the program included twenty-two students and six full-time faculty members.

The program hosts a Student Chapter of the International City-County Management Association (ICMA). The student-led chapter develops program events featuring speakers from the local practitioner community.

Class Format and Meeting Times

The primary mode of delivery for program courses is face-to-face and most courses are classroom based. Two required courses are offered in a hybrid format (a combination of classroom meetings and online sessions). Some electives are offered in a hybrid format or online.

Classes are offered in the evenings from 5:30 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. and each class meets one evening per week on either Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, or Thursday. Courses are also available during the summer semesters.

All program classes are small, ranging from five to fifteen students. The small class size enables students to work closely with faculty and other students. In addition, the small classes offer students numerous opportunities to ask questions and receive individualized attention.

Internships

Students can receive up to six credit hours (equivalent to two elective courses) for internships with a relevant public, non-profit, or private entity so long as the student fulfills the program's internship requirements. Recent internships were held with the following organizations:

Graduation Rates

The graduation rate (83%) for all students entering the Auburn University at Montgomery MPA Program during the 2016-2017 academic year is as follows:

12 students initially enrolled during that academic year:

- 3 or 25% graduated within two years
- 8 or 67% graduated within three years
- 10 or 83% graduated within four years
- 10 or 83% total students graduated and persisting to graduation

Tuition and Fees

The tuition charge for graduate courses for the 2022-2023 academic year for Alabama residents is \$434 per credit hour and \$975 per credit hour for non-Alabama residents. Scholarships

Opportunities for merit-based scholarships are available from various units in the University and the Department of Political Science and Public Administration. These are generally offered to continuing students. All enrolled students are invited to apply.

Application Materials

Applicants are required to have an undergraduate degree and submit official transcripts, official GRE or MAT scores, two letters of reference, a resume, and a 500-word statement of purpose. Test scores are waived for applicants who have earned a master's degree or have five or more years of professional work experience and an undergraduate GPA of 3.0 or higher. *During the current Covid-19 pandemic, we are waiving standardized test scores for all applicants.*

The program uses a rolling admissions process with no set application deadline; we admit new students to start the program in the fall and spring semesters. All application materials should be received at least two weeks prior to the start of the semester in which the prospective student would like to begin the program. Test Scores

The mean MAT score for all admitted students since January 2014 is 391; the mean combined GRE quantitative and verbal score for all admitted students during that same period is 291.
