We are so glad that you are interested in our Department of Computer Science Graduate Teaching Assistant program. You should know that the GA position is directly offered through the Computer Science Faculty Committee and is available on a competitive basis.

There is no application process. Qualified candidates will be contacted directly based on their prior performance and attitudes in their courses.

It is important to note that GTA assignments will prioritize students that have taken the same course at the undergraduate or graduate level and demonstrated strong comprehension of the material. A student cannot be a GTA for a course in which he or she is currently registered or that represents a course in their future plan of study (including cross linked courses). Students who work hard and succeed in their classes have a higher chance of being offered the position.

If you are offered a GTA position with the Computer Science department, you will receive notice through email no later than two weeks prior to the start of the semester.
