<u>Important information</u>

- MPA (PUAD) courses can be taken as electives with approval.
- Graduate methods courses offered by another department at AUM may be taken as an elective with approval.
- POLS 6972 and PUAD 7972 are each a "special topics" course and the topic may vary across semesters. Students may take more than one course numbered POLS 6972 and PUAD 7972 in fulfillment of degree requirements so long as the topic is different each time.
- Not all elective courses are offered every year.
- Ten courses/thirty credit hours are required to earn the MPS degree.
- The minimum GPA needed to receive the MPS degree is a 3.0.
