Please Note: Courses in RED are taught only once per year in the semester indicated on this chart. Failure to take these courses in the semester indicated will result in a wait of one full year for the course to be offered again. Courses in GREEN are offered every other year.

* Students must complete a 6-SH sequence in either Literature (Area II) OR History (Area IV).

The guide provided above illustrates one path students can take in order to graduate in four years without attending summer semesters. A minimum of 120 credit hours is required for graduation. This guide assumes that students are prepared to take core-level math and English classes in their first semester.

This plan is effective August 2018, and supersedes all previous 4-year plans.
