You're going to need your S Number (student number) that was in your acceptance letter, to complete these steps, so be sure to grab that to get started.		
Set up your MyAUM account. You can find <u>a link</u> on the AUM homepage; click on First Time Users under the LOGIN button.		
Read, complete, sign and submit your Bridge Contract. (should receive with acceptance letter, in the mail)
